May we also take this opportunity to mention three villagers who gave up their lives in the Great War of 1914 - 1918:

Private F Veitch - 2nd Bn., East Yorkshire Regiment who died aged 26 on 19 December 1918. Remembered with honour - Mikra British Cemetery, Kalamaria, Greece

Private A C Andrews - 2nd Bn., Lancashire Fusiliers who died on 30 March 1918. Remembered with honour - Duisans British Cemetery, Etrun, Pas de Calais, France.

Private Albert Charles Andrews - "A" Coy. 12 Bn., East Surrey Regiment who died aged 19 on 4 September 1918. Remembered with honour - Esquelbecq Military Cemetery, Nord, France.

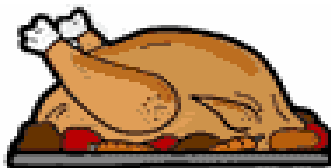
